



WFP-SC Vaccination Policy

Witness for Peace Solidarity Collective requires that all delegates be fully vaccinated and we ask that you please get your booster shot. Delegates will carry their vaccine cards as well as a printed copy on their person while traveling.

While the majority of the Honduran population is vaccinated, we ask for full vaccination as a way to minimize risk of serious illness for delegates, our partners on the ground, and those we meet. Honduras delegations often meet with rural communities with extremely limited access to healthcare. While we regret that this creates a limit for some who want to participate in solidarity delegations, we maintain this as a requirement that we hope will contribute to healthy travel and exchange.

Currently, the Honduras Program requires proof of vaccination and a negative rapid test taken within 24 hours of travel to Honduras. At times, delegates will be asked to wear a mask. We recognize that there is a long list of reasons why people with access to vaccinations do not get vaccinated; on the grounds of health, religion, as well as a justifiable distrust of the U.S.'s racist corporate medical system.

Please let us know if you have a medical exemption. We will review all cases of medical exemptions with rigor and care, and assess whether we can safely provide all necessary accommodations. We will require additional COVID-19 waivers regarding illness, hospitalization, death, and repatriation irrespective of vaccination status.
